## Big Ws: Religious Beliefs

- Both the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons were **pagans**.

Anglo-Saxons	Vikings
Gods lived in “ <b>holy places</b> ”, usually in <b>nature</b>	Gods lived in <b>Asgard (kingdom in the sky)</b>
Chief god was <b>Woden</b>	Chief god was <b>Odin</b>

## Vocabulary

### Anglo-Saxon

The people of England during medieval times.

### artefact

An object of historical interest, such as a tool or decoration.

### longship

A long, narrow warship used by the Vikings.

### pagan

The worship of many gods rather than just one.

### plunder

To steal goods or valuable items from a person or place.

### primary source

A source that comes from a time being studied or from a person who was there.

### secondary source

A source that does not give original information but summarises from a primary source.
