

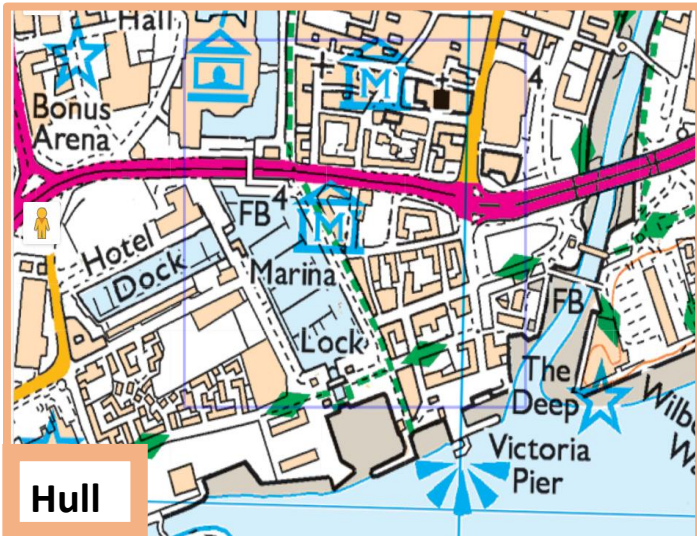

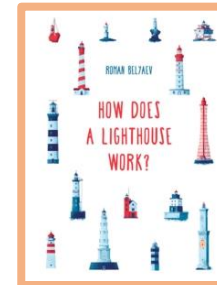
Big Ws: Ordnance Survey (OS) Maps

- **First engineer to build a lighthouse.**

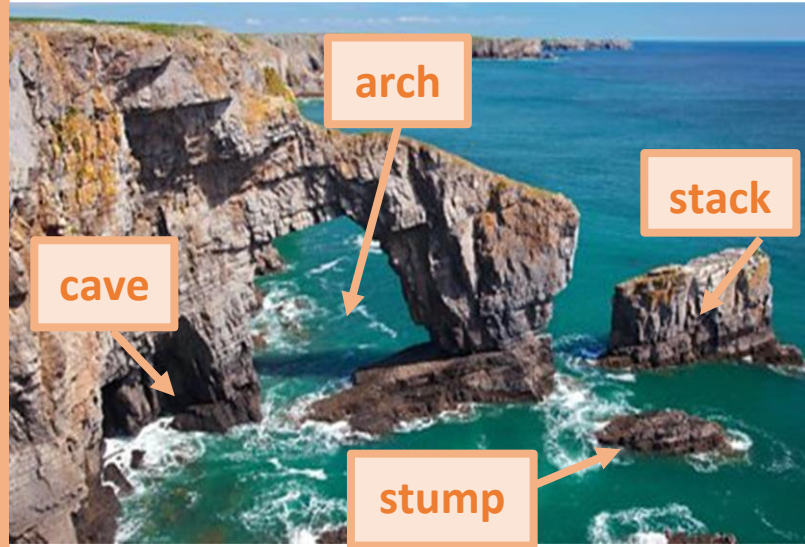


Big Ws: Lighthouses

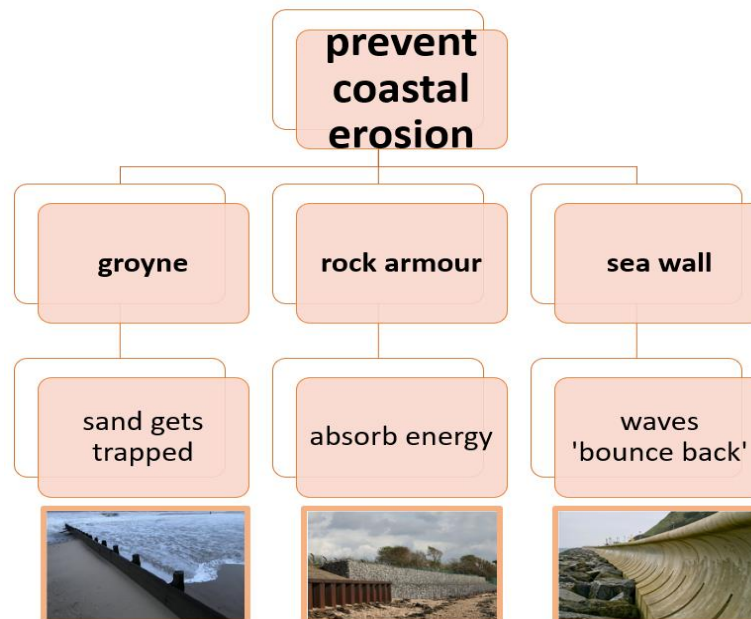
- Different **colours, shapes** and **height** so that **sailors** know their **location is accurate.**
