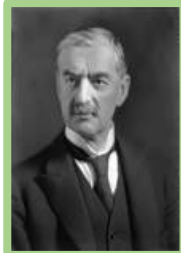
### Important People

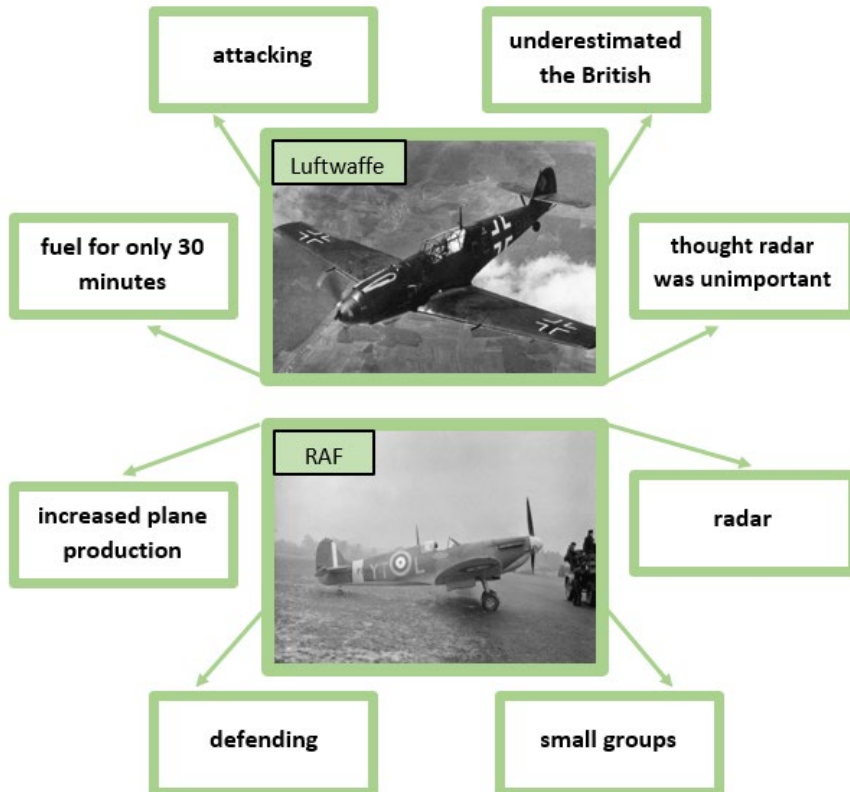
